THE CHILDREN'S WEEK

Class 1: Class 1 have been enjoying lots of traditional tales. They have described the characters from The Princess and the Wizard and sequenced how Princess Eliza changed on a daily basis which linked to our Maths work on time by learning the days of the week. Reception have timed themselves and have counted how many times they can do different things in a minute. Year 1 have been learning to tell the time using o'clock and half past. In RE Reception talked about their experience of crosses and chose how to decorate one. Year 1 have thought about different gifts linking them to the 'disciples' they chose last week. In topic, Reception have continued to look at cold places looking at polar bears and penguins and how people survive. Year 1 have found out about different forms of transport around the world.

Class 2: In R.E. Class 2 have been talking about the gifts of truthfulness, friendship, trust, courage, perseverance, and compassion and deciding which of these gifts apply to the 'disciples' they chose last week. In Geography we used atlases to look at maps of the world to ascertain where different kinds of vehicles come from, such as skidoos and tuk tuks.

In Maths we have been studying o'clock and half past and introducing quarter past in year 1 and looking at telling the time in five minute intervals in year 2. In Literacy we have continued the story of The Princess and the Wizard, by creating party invitations for Princess Eliza's birthday; referring back to our earlier letter writing unit.

Class 3: We have really enjoyed looking at the non-fiction book "Penguins" and have begun writing our introduction for our own non-fiction book about Superheroes. In Maths we have been looking at multiplication and completing some exciting mosaics. Within our topic, of The Greatest Builders, we have been investigating 'Ginger' (the body in the sand). This was a really exciting investigation that led to great discussion.

Class 4 - Miss Randall: In Literacy, the children have now planned their own traditional tales, based on "The Princess' Blankets" and are starting to write their stories. In Numeracy, the children have just finished the fractions and decimals unit and have started a new block about measure. They will be starting to learn about area and perimeter next week.

Class 4 - Mr Evans: Last Friday, Year 6 gave persuasive speeches to the rest of the school, trying to persuade them to vote for the endangered animal they were supporting. It was a close vote with the Elephant group just edging it by 1 point. The children used the results to create pie charts and graphs. Elsewhere, the children have been creating beautifully illustrated Easter eggs to depict elements of the Easter story. They have also continued to produce excellent dinosaur projects and build scenery for their animations.

Year 6 have written a story based on the poem – The Night of the Gargoyles. They thought about creating a spooky atmosphere in their writing. In Maths, they have been practicing their co-ordinates skills, plotting points and solving problems.
