The Children's Week

Classes 1 & 2: Linked to Oliver's Milkshake and finding out all about milk, we plan to hold an event where parents will be invited to come and share milkshake, designed and made by the children, and listen to some songs which we will perform. This will be on **Monday July 2nd at 2.30pm**. Next week the children will be creating invitations which you will receive, so please 'save the date' if you can. Writing instructions about how to make milkshakes will form part of this learning, so we have been looking at the features of instructions for making other milky drinks. We were really proud of 'The Journey of Milk' books which the children produced and you will have the opportunity to see these at the end of term 'book look' on Monday 16th July.

In Maths, year 1 have continued their work on fractions by finding halves of quantities and also by exploring quarters. The year 1's in class 1 have found out how much containers hold using litres. Mrs Hawtin's class will soon have access to the water tray so they can complete this aspect of measurement. Reception have continued working on telling the time and saying days of the week. They have also started work on weight, by comparing the weight of two objects using the balance scales. Year 2 have been continuing their work on symmetry by completing a tricky symmetrical drawing of a house and other pattern work. They have also continued with fractions this week; moving on to problem-solving activities.

In RE, we started a new topic 'How do we care for our Wonderful World? To kick start this, we went out and about to see what we could find in the school grounds. We took photos using the I-Pads and talked about what we could see. On returning to the classroom, the children drew and labelled pictures of things they love in our world. Years 1 and 2 have been looking at their new topic 'Gospel' and thinking about how Jesus chose people from all walks of life as his followers. The children were encouraged to think of which people they would choose to change the world.

'Jobs to do' have included designing a mug for hot chocolate, finding half and writing our stories based on our story plans.

Class 3: Class 3 began the week with Mrs Timmins continuing with their Science experiments. They have now created conclusions as to what a plant needs to survive and analysed their predictions. In Literacy, they have been writing recounts of the Tabula Rasa, a short animation they've been focusing on. In Maths, the children have been looking at telling the time with increasing accuracy and comparing it to a 24hour clock. Finally, in RE, they've begun to look at Judaism and where it was founded.

Class 4: This week, Class 4 have been concentrating on creating atmosphere in their writing. They have been building paragraphs to describe a scene from a quest myth. In Maths, year 5 have been adding and subtracting decimals with year 6 solving problems with angles and 3D shapes. In topic work, the children have been exploring Greek architecture, particularly ancient temples and the three different styles of columns. They have also researched the important buildings that were found in the centre of Athens in 500BC and reflected on what that tells us about life in Ancient Greece.

Quad Kids Athletics

On Tuesday afternoon, 18 year 3 & 4 children attended a Quad Kids event at Colyton Grammar School. They took part in 4 different activities, including; vortex howler, 75m sprint, 400m run and a standing long jump. It was fantastic to see the team spirit demonstrated across the squad, all of whom were a credit to our school! Beer Blazers did incredibly well and came 3rd, only 8 points off 2nd place. Well done to every child who took part and many thanks to the parents who came to support!!

Netball High 5's Training

For the past two Tuesdays 20 year 4 & 5 children have been attending a High 5's Netball training event at Axe Valley Academy. They've taken part in a variety of training activities including; shooting, passing, defending, game scenarios and footwork drills. Every child had a fantastic time and are now prepared for the league in September. Many thanks to all the parents who helped with transport.
