The Children's Week

Classes 1 & 2: What another busy week, which started with our milkshake event which everybody seemed to enjoy – see below. The children saw how milkshakes were made and thought about what is needed and the instructions to tell someone how to do it. We have started to think about linking farming in England and Africa and the children have thought about similarities and differences.

In Maths, the children have been working on describing different movements of turn such as quarter, half and full turn. Reception have been weighing with cubes and ordering their results. Class 2 have continued with assessment work and number activities.

In RE, Reception looked at the Creation story, listened to a song and drew a sequence of pictures and wrote captions to illustrate this. In Key stage 1 the children talked about the subject of forgiveness. Jesus taught: 'Forgive and you will be forgiven'. They put these words of Jesus in the centre of a large piece of paper and worked together to draw cartoons of people who need forgiving. Then they discussed the idea that God forgives people who say sorry and whether we should forgive people who say sorry too?

To finish the week and by the time you read this, we will have been to the beach. This was to observe the beach in summer and compare with our previous visit in January in order to notice seasonal changes. We will be decorating pebbles and leaving them on the beach so if you spot any please let us know.

In the afternoon, the children will be in the classes that they will be in in September and thinking about next year.

Class 3: The children began the week in Literacy writing a detailed setting description using all of their senses, these were excellent and they really enjoyed the descriptive elements. Following on from this, they created descriptive posters and were able to edit these to make improvements. This week in Topic, the children have furthered their investigation into Viking life. They have explored and designed their own Viking weapons and have discussed how Viking's raided. Within Maths, they've finished their unit on time with an enquiry into durations between start and end times.

Class 4: Another BUSY week in Class 4 this week with transition days for some of the Year 6's, Life Skills and Play Leader training – oh, and a bit of work too! The class have been writing their chapters for the collaborative Greek myth with some very creative and imaginative ideas on show. The children also learnt about conflict in Ancient Greece. They researched Greek hoplite's and what they would have worn as well as discover what happened in the war between Persia and Athens at the Battle of Marathon.

Playground Leader Training – By Jack and Hannah

On Thursday 5th July, some year 5's (Anna, Hannah, Jack, Selby, Jacob, Archie, Tilly, Chloe, Poppy, Sophie and Jasmine) all went to Colyton Grammar School. We were joined by children from All Saints and St Marys. We played some games like 'sun and ice', 'jumping jacks' and 'rats and rabbits'. We had a playground each that we could play in. We could teach other school games we made up too. The purpose of going there was to learn how to play well with the younger children. We can't wait until next year to be playground leaders!

Year 6 Life Skills

On Wednesday 4th July, the Year 6's went to the Donkey Sanctuary for this year's life skills event. The children learnt a range of important skills such as: life-saving and resuscitation, keeping safe online, how to keep healthy and fire safety. The children demonstrated an excellent level of knowledge and participated brilliantly in the activities. A good time was had by all!
