#### The Children's Week

**Class 1**: Another jam-packed week with final practices for Harvest. I was so proud of class 1 for their performance in church and also it was great to have feedback from other members of staff to say how brilliant they had all been during whole school practices. In Maths, year 1 have been focusing on 'one less' and then combining this with 'one more' to show that they know the difference between the two. Reception have been ordering bears by counting the spots on the bears' tummies and then using a number line to write matching numbers. In Literacy, we have concluded our work on Goldilocks by producing 'wanted' posters using adjectives that we have collected over the unit to describe her appearance, character and crimes. Reception have collected words to match the sounds they know.

**Class 2:** Preparing for Harvest has been one of our foci this week. The children have practised creative movement for our dance and have been learning lots of Harvest songs. In Maths, we have continued to investigate all the different ways of making up to hundreds, tens and ones. In our Quests the children have been looking at maps to find the equator and the oceans around the continent of Africa. In writing, the children have been evaluating their writing with me and looking at their next steps. We are very excited about our trip to Paignton Zoo today and will give a report next week.

**Class 3:** It has been a really busy week in school. Between practice for the Harvest festival, learning our new song "We'll meet again," the National Anthem, and cross country, we've managed to squeeze in; diary writing and editing in Literacy (this was using our very neatest handwriting!), as well as writing invites to the residential home, inviting them personally to our evacuee day. During our topic lesson, we have begun to create Blitz artwork that already looks superb. I can't wait to see the finished versions, with the addition of the search lights and silhouettes! In RE, we've continued to look at Judaism, thinking about and ordering the story of Moses. Finally, within our Maths lessons we've been looking at rounding to the nearest 10 and 100. This can be a tricky topic, but I believe we've cracked it!

**Class 4:** This week, class 4 have been working really hard at developing their paragraph writing. They have been combining information using conjunctions and looking at how to be creative in their sentence structures. In Maths, the children showed good progress in their end of unit assessment and have carried out an elicitation task for their new unit. Year 5's will be focussing on addition and subtraction for the next 3 weeks and year 6's will concentrate on all four number operations. The children have practised for Harvest and have continued producing some excellent work in our Topic lessons. The shoe-box trenches are really coming on!

#### News from the dinner hall.

Our MTAS's have worked hard to establish a 'mindful eating' atmosphere in the school hall. This involves ensuring the environment is friendly, sociable and calm and where manners are expected to be shown. This is wholly in line with the Church ethos and school values that the children are now familiar with.

The MTA's are encouraging the children to eat what they have been given and to try food that maybe unfamiliar to them.
