RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: The children will be looking at how Christians believe that Jesus inaugurated the 'Kingdom of God' and that Jesus is still alive. They will be able to offer suggestions about what the description of Pentecost in Acts 2 might mean and give examples of what Pentecost means to some Christians now.

GEOGRAPHY: The children will be investigating human geography focusing upon land use and settlements for both the Vikings and the Anglo-Saxons. They will research physical geography to understand the methods of transport for the Vikings, and how different rivers have changed, focusing upon the River Axe.

DESIGN TECHNOLOGY: The children will be creating their own Viking items, including; settlements, long boats and shields.

MATHS: The children will continue their investigative techniques focusing on Maths mastery and learning how to represent ideas in a variety of different ways. They will be focusing on; fractions and decimals, money, statistics, time, geometry focusing on properties of shapes.

Links to Core Values:

Learning Behaviour:

Community – working together as a team.

Risk Taking – learning about the strategies the Vikings used to invade.

PE: This term, the children will be developing their skills in striking and fielding sports as well as improving their own personal performances in athletics.

HISTORY:

The children will be learning about the Vikings and Anglo-Saxon struggle for the Kingdom of England to the time of Edward the Confessor. They will be investigating, comparing and contrasting the different ways in which the Anglo-Saxons and the Vikings lived. They take part in Archaeological digs, create settlements and explore the art and culture.

Key Learning Outcome:
The children will present their own
Viking/Anglo Saxon day at the end of term.

SCIENCE:

The children will be working with plants to identify and describe different parts, explore the requirements for a plant to grow and how this varies from plant to plant.

They will also investigate the different way in which water is transported within plants and explore the part that flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants.

ICT: The children will learn to use technology safely, respectfully and responsibly; recognise acceptable/unacceptable behaviour; identify a range of ways to report concerns about content and contact.

MUSIC: The children will listen with attention to detail to a variety of different artists and recall sounds with increasing aural memory.
